
"St. John of the Cross Explains In Considerable Detail The Purification Of The Soul By The Infused Light Of God."

Trappist monk Thomas Merton (1915-1968) was one of the world's most widely read, talked about, and beloved authors, poets, contemplatives, and spiritual teachers.
